has become the cornerstone;

North Side: 23 the Lord has done this,
and it is marvelous in our eyes.

South Side: 24 The Lord has done it this very day;
let us rejoice today and be glad.

North Side: 25 Lord, save us!
Lord, grant us success!

South Side: 26 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
From the house of the Lord we bless you.

North Side: 27 The Lord is God,
and he has made his light shine on us.

With boughs in hand, join in the festal procession
up[c] to the horns of the altar.

South Side: 28 You are my God, and I will praise you;
you are my God, and I will exalt you.

North Side: 29 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good;
his love endures forever.
