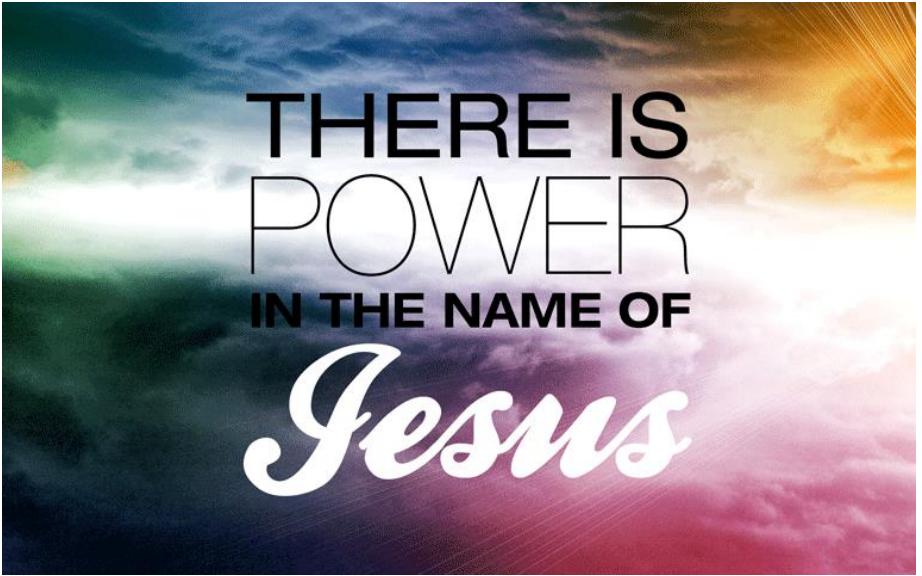

- **Summer Theme: Keep the fire going**

What makes the church different from other associations of people? How can we fulfill the mandate of Jesus' great commission? If we want to grow continuously and reach out to people, we need God's power and creative energy, which is the Holy Spirit. "The Holy Spirit changes a theory into a commandment, an option into a mandate, and speculation into commission." The early church grew despite external persecutions and internal challenges because the power of God was at work through the Holy Spirit. Even though 2,000 years have passed since the church was birthed, we can still learn about growth from the Acts of the Apostles.

During the summer, we will explore with our pastors how the Holy Spirit of God enabled the fearful disciples to become faithful witnesses to participate in God's mission and turn the world upside down.

SUPPORT FOR UKRAINIAN REFUGEES

We have become aware of ways to support Ukrainian Refugees as they make their way to Waterloo Region.

1: ITEMS TO DONATE: A list of items currently needed is listed below. Please donate only items on the list. No clothing, winter items or toys right now. Most needed:

- ✓ Flour, salt, pepper, baking supplies, coffee dry beans, rice, juice, drinking boxes
- ✓ New pillows
- ✓ New or nearly new bedding and towels
- ✓ New underwear for men and women and youth bras
- ✓ Sunscreen, hair brushes and combs, shaving gel, shampoo, body wash, teen products, chap stick, hand and body lotion, Q-tips, hair products, hair ties, ladies' razors, deodorant and band aids
- ✓ Running shoes and summer shoes for children
- ✓ Gift cards for grocery stores
- ✓ Crafts and games for kids 10 and up.

Donations may be dropped off at 130 Weber Street W, Unit 101 Kitchener (the old Caya Fabrics building). Enter the driveway to the parking lot off Wellington St past the second house. For donations and to visit the store, go to the walkway on the right side of the building by the sunflowers on the fence and up a few stairs. Open Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays 10-4:30.
