Singing Together:

Church Council has decided to invite the congregation to sing (with masks and distancing) starting November 28, the first Sunday of Advent, as long as there are no new public health restrictions to the contrary. We recognize that some are eager for this change while others may be more cautious. Here's what you can expect:

- We will open a few windows slightly for ventilation so be prepared and dress accordingly.
- Our intention is to provide options that will respect each other's preferences. E.g. Those who are more cautious but still want to attend may feel safer toward the back of the sanctuary without people singing behind them.
- When greeting each other, we encourage asking about the other person's comfort level. A slight bow, bumping elbows, a handshake or warm words and smiles are some of the options.
- We continue to encourage vaccinations as an important way to protect each other.
- For those who aren't ready to come back, please continue to participate through the livestream link in the weekly bulletin in order to remain connected virtually until such time as being together in person is possible for everyone.
