

The Connections Committee is compiling a list of learning opportunities. Eventually we will have a library shelf with Indigenous authors, a list of resources and also some interactive experiences. Learning opportunity: Listen to a first-hand account of a Mennonite man who unwittingly signed up for the Alternative Service and was looking for adventure and became the janitor at a Mennonite-run residential school in northern Ontario. The link is <u>here.</u>

Signs of healing and restoration: Episode six in the same series (see link above) is about a Mennonite Disaster Service project with Ontario Mennonite youth helping to restore the Mohawk Institute, a Residential School in Brantford that was operated by the Anglican Church of Canada from 1831 to 1969.
